## AIMS AND ETHOS

At King's High, the world beyond the classroom is at the heart of our educational vision. Alongside truly exceptional Sport, Music, Drama and Art, our co-curricular programme is remarkably rich and varied, tailored to offer the very best opportunities to each and every student.

With over 180 weekly activities, in addition to our acclaimed Friday Afternoon Activity Programme, there is a wealth of opportunity to discover gifts and talents, to develop interests and passions, and to promote health and wellbeing.

Our co-curriculum is carefully designed around core themes: global citizenship, creativity and self-expression, leadership and entrepreneurship, health and wellbeing, and vital character attributes including empathy, confidence, resilience and integrity.

At the centre of our co-curricular programme is the importance of community and our work to foster a strong sense of social responsibility. With an extensive network of partnerships locally, nationally and globally, we are passionate about nurturing the socially responsible, environmentally intelligent global citizens of the future.

Whilst we are very proud of key headline achievements such as being shortlisted for Independent School of the Year for Performing Arts, or being ranked 13th nationally for sport among girls' independent schools, the core focus on the programme is on breadth and depth of engagement. Sport, Music, Drama and Art are for everyone at King's High and so, too, are all the other activities, groups and societies. We strongly encourage every student to embrace the programme and take up at least three co-curricular activities each week.

### **The programme for the Autumn Term 2021**

We are proud to offer over 185 co-curricular activities for the Autumn Term and the following information outlines those that are available for your daughter. We recommend that your daughter takes advantage of these enrichment opportunities. It is possible for her to book in for one each lunch time and again after school. There may be some activities which will be added in the first few weeks of term. This will be communicated with parents and students and a live version of the timetable is always available on SOCS (the School Calendar, Co-curricular and Sports communication system).





SPORT

Sport is an integral part of the school day for many girls at King’s and this extends to our extensive co-curricular offering. Every year there are in excess of 30 different sports that girls are able to enjoy. Girls are encouraged to explore a wide range of opportunities from traditional activities such as Netball and Hockey through to activities such as Clay Pigeon Shooting and Fencing. Pupils can compete in a wide range of sports and enjoy others at a more recreational level should they wish.

Competitive sport

Most of our co-curricular sports offer our pupils the opportunity to compete against other schools in Local, Regional and National competitions. There are regular weekday and Saturday fixtures in our major sports of Hockey, Netball, Cricket and Tennis throughout the academic year. Pupils are encouraged to compete up to National level in the major sports of Swimming and Water Polo. Other opportunities are available to compete or gain grades in activities such as Football, Ballet, Street Dance and Martial Arts.

Support

The department runs a Talented Athlete Programme which recognises pupils who are excelling in their chosen sporting discipline, and provides them with support and guidance to follow their sporting ambitions. Pupils on the programme have access to daily wellbeing and load monitoring; strength and conditioning training; small group sport specific training; departmental mentors and opportunities to hear talks and lectures on topics such as sports psychology and nutrition.



Trips

The sports department runs regular tours and trips. These include junior sports tours in Hockey and Netball in Key Stage 3 to locations such as Jersey and Holland. Senior Hockey and Netball tours have travelled to South Africa in recent years where girls enjoy the experience of playing sport in another country as well as being exposed to a different culture. Other trips include visits to watch elite level sport.



## MUSIC

There are many instrumental ensembles and choirs across the department.

### Choirs

Singing together starts right from the earliest years and there is a choir to suit everyone. At the senior end of the school there are two chamber choirs: one for Years 7-9 and one for Year 10 and above. For advanced singers there is the chance to join the Foundation Chamber Choir in collaboration with the boys from Warwick School, which opens out the broader choral repertoire written for Soprano, Alto, Tenor and Bass.

### Orchestras

There are KS3 and senior orchestras and the more advanced orchestral players are encouraged to join the Foundation Symphony Orchestra in collaboration with Warwick School. This orchestra has recently performed at Birmingham's Symphony Hall on invitation from Music for Youth. There is also a Foundation Wind Orchestra that regularly wins awards.

### Other ensembles

In addition to the large groups there are windbands, brass groups and jazz groups. There is also the opportunity to play in rock and pop bands or small chamber music ensembles. Pupils are encouraged to form their own groups, to write their own pieces and songs and are given the platform to perform.

### Performance opportunities

During the school year there are many opportunities to perform for all ages.

There are two large-scale concerts each year held in the Warwick Hall. Solo instrumentalists can demonstrate their progress in our Musical Horizons series, whilst the finest performers may be offered the chance to perform a full solo recital for the public, either at St Mary's Church in Warwick or in our fabulous new Auditorium at school. Our new Friday Live series has been a hugely popular opportunity to perform informally during lunchtimes.

In addition, there are Foundation Concerts featuring the Foundation Symphony and Wind Orchestras. Musicians also enjoy supporting the drama department in their excellent and varied musical theatre productions each year, bringing a multi-disciplinary approach to our musical creativity.

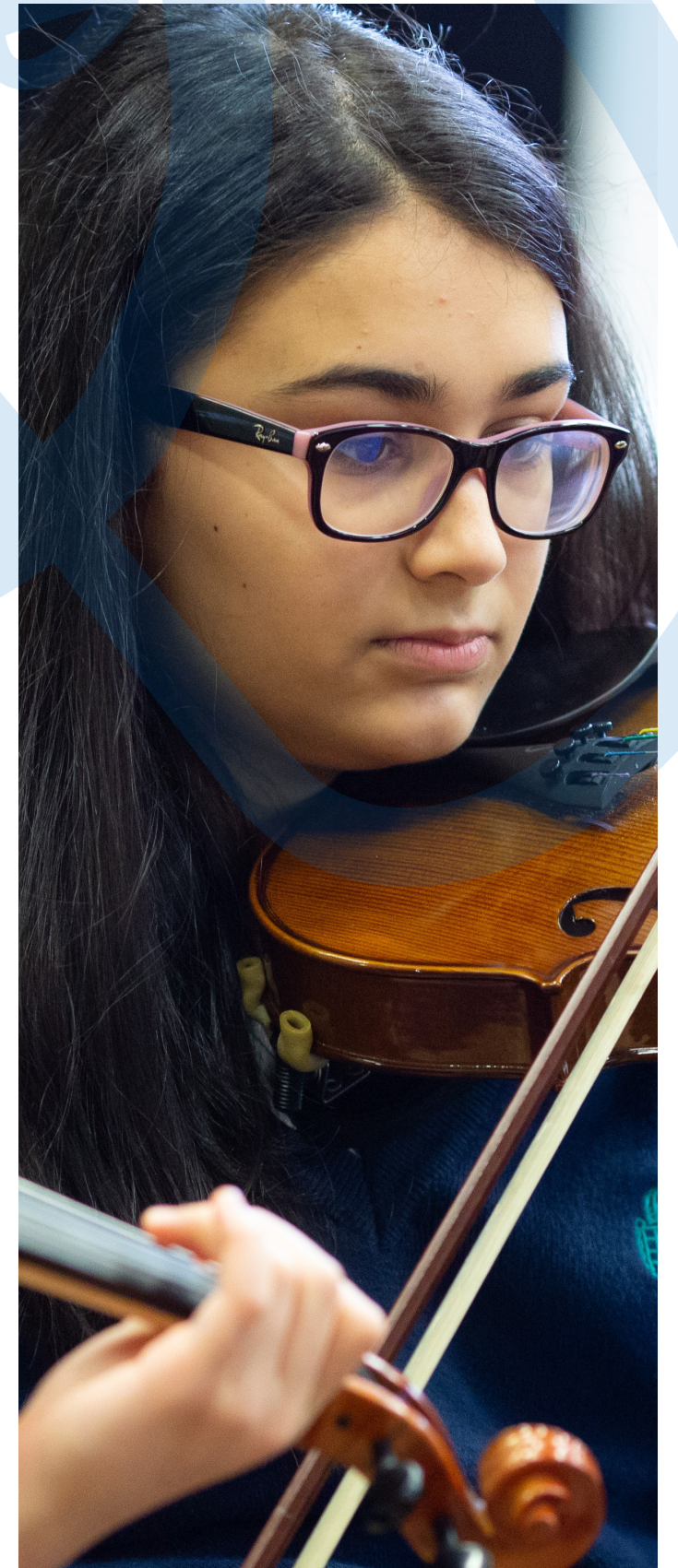

### Masterclasses, talks and concert visits

## DRAMA

Each year group has a regular weekly lunchtime Drama Club, open to all, which are led by our Sixth Form Drama Scholars. Students enjoy Drama games, activities and workshops as they hone performance skills and build towards smaller performance pieces. There are also activities run jointly with Warwick School which are open to all including Motionhouse Fridays and Saturday Morning Drama.

### Productions

### Theatre Visits & Trips

We run numerous theatre visits and are incredibly fortunate to have The Bridge House Theatre on site offering a range of professional performances that are easily accessible to our students. In addition, we visit local theatres such as Warwick Arts Centre and the Royal Shakespeare Company, as well as venturing to London to view West End productions. Recent shows have included War Horse, The Mousetrap and The Tempest. We have also organised residential trips to London and New York where, as well as soaking in the culture of these vibrant cities, students participate in theatre workshops and see a variety of shows.

### Masterclasses/series of talks

We are lucky to have a range of “friends” of the department including many alumnae who work within the performing arts industry who hold talks and workshops for our students. Not only does this develop students’ performance and technical skill set, but it widens their understanding of the industry. Past talks and workshops have been given by Sir Michael Attenborough, Paapa Essiedu, John Caird, Patrick Robinson and alumnae including Sophie Turner, Nadia Parkes and Ronay Poole.





ART

Co-curricular Art is also extremely popular and successful with many activities across all age ranges. We offer to name just a few: Year 7, 8 and 9 ceramics clubs (both at lunch and after school), Year 8 printmaking, Year 9 drop-in, GCSE support and extension and the A Level students have an open-door opportunity to work whenever they have study periods, lunchtime and after school.

**Exhibitions**  
Every year, the department hosts a joint exhibition with Warwick Preparatory School. This fabulous display encompasses work from the youngest children in our Foundation from Nursery right through to the eldest in the Upper Sixth. We exhibit publicly and open with the support of local dignitaries and VIP's. Recent exhibitions have been held at The Court House, Warwick and also The Old Shire Hall, Warwick.

**Art Visits & Trips**  
We run numerous trips across all age ranges which encompass gallery visits to London and Oxford whilst also retaining strong links locally in and around Warwick. Art trips play a prominent role in the Inspire programme and we offer cross-curricular visits such as Geography and Art at Compton Verney and also with Biology to Oxford Bi-annually we run the On-Form sculpture trip for Key Stage 3 which is a wonderful experience.

**Masterclasses/series of talks**  
Last year we launched the Inspire Art programme which complements the whole school Inspire initiative. Within Inspire Art, we aim to promote the power of creativity and raise the profile of Art across our school community. Since February we have had the most amazing series of talks from a wide range of artists, art historians, designers and universities. Under the umbrella of Inspire Art the lower sixth students oversee and manage the new Art Society which is entitled the Da Vinci Society. This amazing co-curricular society appeals to all age ranges and offers talks, workshops, conversations over art, design, engineering, product design and so much more.
